Emotional, personal and social skills

1. Learn to respect each others differences.

Parental involvement/Visits (to & from)

1. Talk about their own and family's hair or visits to the barbers/hairdressers.
2. Talk about hairstyles and special occasions.

Communication and language skills

1. Listen with enjoyment.
2. Discuss vocabulary.
3. Practice pre-writing: straight, wavy, curly and spiky in sand tray, and with felt tips, paint or crayons.
4. Talk about their own hair/their family's hair.
5. Talk about going to the barber/hairdresser; 'special' hair styles for parties, weddings etc.

Expressive and aesthetic skills

1. Draw/paint different hair styles.
2. Use play-doh to make different hair styles.
3. Make collage of people with different hairstyles using string (fine or coarse – maybe frayed), wool, 'spret-doon wirsit' etc or cut paper strips.
4. Set up hair-dressers for imaginative play (no real scissors).

Knowledge and understanding of the world

1. Talk about hair colour. Texture and accessories.
2. At the hairdressers – shampoo, scissors, clippers, mousse, comb, brush etc. What are they and what are they for?
3. Ribbons, clasps, beads etc.

Physical development and movement skills

1. Cut strips for 'hair' collage to help fine muscle development.

Focus learning outcomes

- Experience hearing and using dialect
- Increasing English and Shetland vocabulary
- Learning to observe and describe different styles, textures and colours.
- Have fun and gain confidence.
