### Expressive Arts

- Draw pictures or make a wall frieze to illustrate the poems. Put captions in Shetland dialect.
- Act out the sequence of events for Liza Yaal.
- Make bugs and take peats into the classroom to make up a display for the rhyme 'Ahint a Blue Roog'.
- Knit buas.

### Technologies

- Make up a talking book. The children could draw pictures to depict the scenes or they could create pictures on the computer.

### Language

- Listen to the poems for enjoyment. Discuss the meaning of any unknown vocabulary. Use the pictures to help understanding and discussion.
- Read and listen to Little Boy Blue, Little Miss Muffet and Jack and Jill. Compare these with the Shetland dialect versions of the nursery rhymes.
